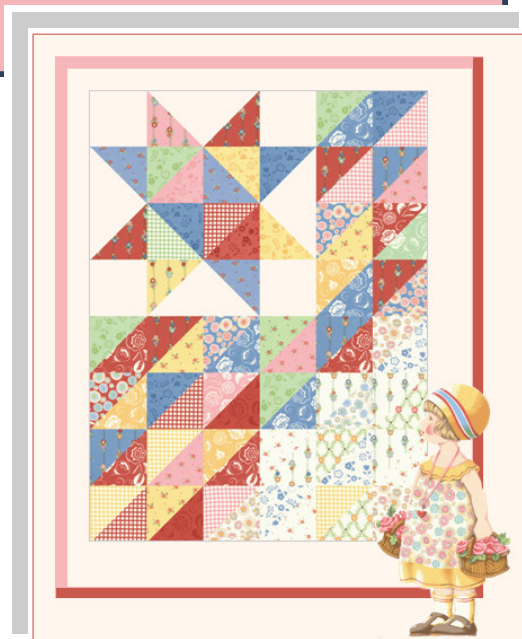


# Basket Full of Turnovers

Wall hanging (44" x 54")
80 Turnover Triangles
1 Panel for girl
1 ½ yards Background Fabric
⅛ yard Inner Border Color 1
⅛ yard Inner Border Color 2
3 yards Backing
½ yard Binding (cut 6 – 2 ½" strips)



Width of fabric calculated at 40" of workable fabric. All seams are ¼".

## Background

From your background fabric cut the following:

- 1 – 6" strip. Then cut 4 – 6" squares. Cut each of those in half diagonally to get 8 triangles.
- 1 – 5 ½" strip. Then cut 4 – 5 ½" squares.
- 5 – 2 ½" strips. Put aside for borders.
- 6 – 4 ½" strips. Put aside for borders.

## Inner Borders

From your Inner Border fabric cut the following:

- Cut 3 – 1 ½" strips from Inner Border Color 1. Put aside for borders.
- Cut 3 – 1 ½" strips from Inner Border Color 2. Put aside for borders.

### Tip:

These will make the star points. Pick turnover fabrics that have good contrast to your background.

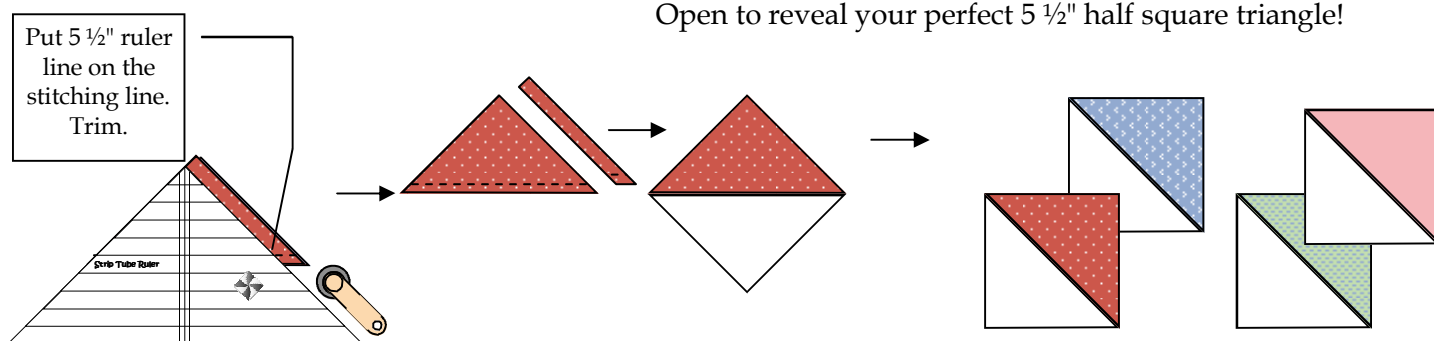
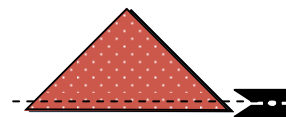
## Making the Blocks

Put a turnover triangle right sides together with a background triangle (see Tip).

With a ¼" seam, sew together as pictured. Don't open yet.

Now, square up to 5 ½". To make this super easy, use [The Strip Tube Ruler™](#).

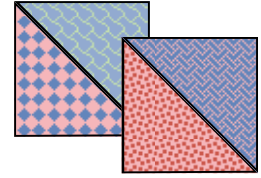
With the triangle still together, place the 5 ½" ruler line on the stitching line so that the left edge of the ruler lines up with the left edge of the triangle\*. Slice off the fabric on the right. (\*If you are left handed, line up with the right side of the triangle. Slice off the left.)



Continue on to make 8 – 5 ½" half square triangles from turnovers and background.

### Making the Blocks (continued)

Using the same sewing and squaring up technique, partner two turnover fabrics together to make print half square triangles. (See Tip Below)



Make 36 – 5 ½" half square triangles from turnover fabrics.

Add the background squares and assemble your blocks as pictured below (before borders).

Tip:

I put all of the light turnovers together and arranged them in the bottom right of the patchwork so they would create a subtle transition.

Now, add the borders in the following order:

#### Border 1

1. Top (2 ½" of background)
2. Left (2 ½" of background)
3. Bottom (4 ½" of background)
4. Right (4 ½" of background)

#### Border 2

1. Top (1 ½" of Color 1)
2. Left (1 ½" of Color 1)
3. Bottom (1 ½" of Color 2)
4. Right (1 ½" of Color 2)

#### Border 3

1. Top (2 ½" of background)
2. Left (2 ½" of background)
3. Bottom (4 ½" of background)
4. Right (4 ½" of background)

Fussy cut the girl from the panel and appliqué onto the quilt!

Layer, Quilt, Bind, and Enjoy!
